Sanctifying the Shabbat

Shabbat is a precious gift from God and an eternal sign between God and his people (Exo. 31:17). It is based on two interrelated commands: Zakhor, to remember (Exo. 20:8) and Shamor, to observe (Deu. 5:12). We celebrate this gift with the fruit of the vine, a covenant reminder, setting this day apart from the other six days.
