Ladder of Mastery

Novice: unconsciously incompetent

Apprentice: consciously incompetent

Journeyman: consciously competent

Master: subconsciously competent

Stress and Self-Awareness

Class 1 - aware of the scenery on the shore, the weather above, the state of his group

Class 2 - aware of what is immediately ahead, still talking to canoe partner but unaware of the grizzly on the banks or the clouds gathering overhead
