This is the first parshah of the Book of B'midbar (in the wilderness), known in English as Numbers. The Israelites have fled Egypt, received the revelation of Torah from Mt. Sinai, erected the Tabernacle and have been instructed in its operation. They now prepare both spiritually and militarily for their travels to the land of promise. A census of the families, including a count of able-bodied adult men is ordered. The arrangement of the people in their encampments is centered on the Tabernacle, emphasizing the responsibilities of Aaron, his descendants, and the tribe of Levi.

The Haftarah predicts Israel's innumerable growth, and that one day HaShem will lead her back into the wilderness to reclaim her fidelity.

Year 1 Aliyah Highlights

- 1. Nu. 2:1-9 Those camping on the east set out first Y'hudah, Yissakhar, Zvulun (186, 400). According to tradition, each tribe had a banner ($de-gel - \neg \neg$) colored according to the stones on the breastplate of the High Priest (Ex. 39:14), and each division (unit of three tribes), thousand, hundred fifty or ten had its own standard.
- 2. Nu. 2:10-16 Those camping on the south set out second Re'uven, Shim'on, Gad (151,450).
- 3. Nu. 2:17-24 The Tabernacle and the Levitical guard, divided into the Gershonites and Merarites between the first and second divisions, with the Kohathites in the center column between the second and third divisions, are described in motion (encampment described in Ch. 3). Those camping on the west set out third – Efrayim, M'nasheh, Binyamin (108,100).
- 4. Nu. 2:25-31 Those camping on the north set out last Dan, Asher, Naftali (157,600).
- 5. Nu. 2:32-34 The summary mirrors Nu. 1:46-48. Language here indicates a military deployment, anticipating marching orders that will be given in full (Nu. 10:11-28).
- 6. Nu. 3:1-4 At Mt. Sinai: The descendants of Aharon echo Ex. 6:23 and Le. 10:1-2. Moshe is counted with Aharon (Nu.3:38) and not with the Levites. Of the 78 times Moshe and Aharon are mentioned together, Aharon is listed first only genealogically (Ex. 6:20, Nu. 3:1, 26:59, 1Ch. 5:29, 23:13), as he is the firstborn. To "ordain" is literally "to fill the hands" (*mi-le yadam – מָרָא עָרָם)*.
- 7. Nu. 3:5-13 The tribe of Levi were on guard duty (Nu. 1:53). The Levites replaced the sacred duty of the firstborn



Theme

The Wilderness bewilders – It represents barrenness, danger, death, chaos, darkness; God's absence in contrast to the Tabernacle. It belongs to no one, and to everyone. It is free of charge. It is a place of silence. It is a place of transition, where two separate identities form a third, singular identity. It is a place of revelation. A place of our youth (Je. 2:2). Openness, vulnerability. Alienation. A place of death for an entire generation. It is necessary.

- 6. (4:3) Thirty years old seems a good age to begin service to God. Where are you in relation to age, growing and serving? (Rom 8:29-30, 2Co 9:8, Eph 3:20-21, Phil 2:13)
